Who is Michael Rakowitz?



The gallery plays host to a collection of trees, plants, flowers, and herbs requested by the local community of migrants, who miss aspects of their home landscapes. Amongst the plants are new artworks: small sculptures made from cardboard and a large panel collage made from food packaging.




