The Technical Manager leads the technical planning, management and delivery of Baltic's installations, exhibitions, learning programmes and events. The Technical Manager sits within the Production Team alongside the Production Manager & Registrar, the Senior Technician and Workshop Technician.

Exhibition and Programme Production

- Lead Production Meetings for Baltic's gallery exhibitions
- Plan and manage the installation and de-installation of the Baltic's gallery exhibitions in close collaboration with the Curators
- Plan and manage the installation and de-installation of commissions, displays, special projects and public events across the building working with creative teams (curatorial, learning, civic engagement)
- Lead on the production of layouts and technical drawings to facilitate exhibition design development and exhibition build
- Lead on the planning of AV installations for exhibitions, performances and events
- To source, appoint and manage freelance technicians, specialists and external contractors for install and de-install. To support the development of the freelance technical team to meet the needs of Baltic's evolving artistic programme
- Actively support the installation team in troubleshooting complex technical issues towards the realisation of exhibitions and curatorial projects, including assisting on the ground where necessary and providing a positive attitude during exhibition turnaround and project delivery
- To prepare cost estimates, quotations and make purchases. To support the Production Manager with budget management. To work within budgets and to track and communicate possible changes in costs in a timely manner
- To communicate within the Creative Team on the status of projects from a technical perspective. To participate in a culture of collaboration

- To support the Technical Team with exhibition and workshop maintenance
- To support the Production Manager and Registrar with environmental control of exhibition spaces
- To support the Production Manager and Registrar on artwork transport in and out of the building
- To manage secure storage of artwork and related material in the fine art store
- To support in the design of protective packaging and support systems for the safe transport of art
- To support the management of in-house facilities (AV equipment and machinery) and ensure maintenance and safe operation of the workshop and its equipment

- To support the Technical Team in stock control of fabrication materials and the purchasing of consumables and equipment. To safely store materials including COSHH.
- To operate the fork-lift truck and scissor lift platform as required
