Baltic unveils early Spring events with craft market, unique Anti-Valentine's Party and Mother's Day Afternoon Tea

Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art has unveiled three new events for adults and families in February and March - an alternative Anti-Valentine's Party evening (Sat 14 Feb), an independent Makers Market (Sat 28 Feb 11:00-17:00) and a Mother's Day Picnic Afternoon Tea (Sun 15 Mar).

Bad romance will be on display at Baltic on Saturday 14 February as the gallery invites singles, friends and couples looking for an alternate Valentine's night to ditch the roses and enjoy an **Anti-Valentine's Party Night**.

Featuring drag performances from Dollhaus dolls - including Mea T. Cleaver, Kealea Sin Love, Leviathanne, Laila Sagittaria and Strawberry Fatcake - the night will also include music from North-East DJs Cousin Dan, Westy, and Becky Woodcock, all in collaboration with Big Beat Manifesto. Tickets include a free pizza slice and there are three indulgent cocktails on sale that align with the night's theme - The Toxic X, The Break-up and The TonICK. Guests are invited to dance, enjoy the performances and vent their biggest turn offs by adding icks to the 'ICK' wall.
