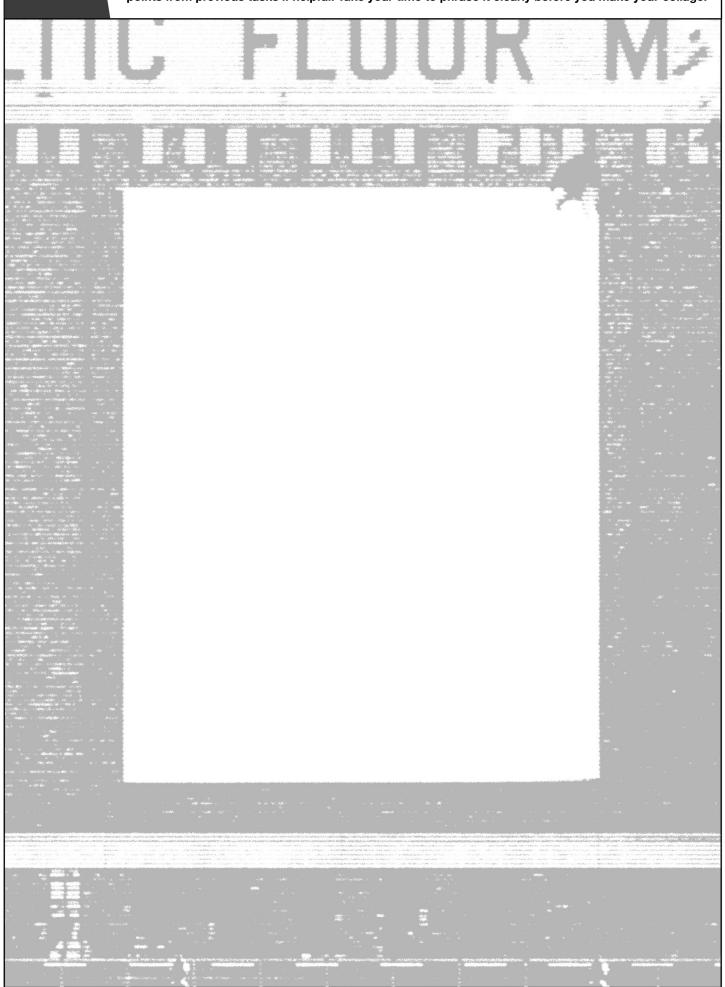

'How To Work Better' by Fischli and Weiss (1991) features a motivational list the artists originally found on a notice board in a ceramics factory in Thailand. The artists went on to reproduce the list as large-scale murals in multiple locations – advising people, 'Do one thing at a time' and 'Know the problem', amongst other suggestions. 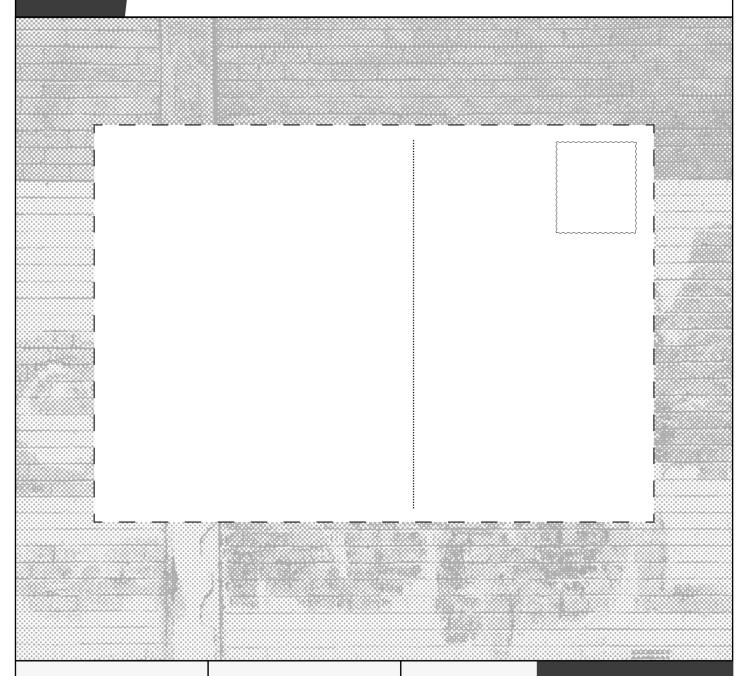

Over the autumn of 2024, Yoko Ono's iconic 'IMAGINE PEACE' banner was restaged, suspended outside the Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art. Yoko Ono is a master of the instructional artwork or event score. Ono's classic book 'Grapefruit' (1964) suggests other actions, for example 'Listen to a heart beat', 'Draw a map to get lost', 'Listen to the sound of the world turning'. Use the collage sheet provided to spell out one positive instruction to beam out from the quayside. You can use the starting points from previous tasks if helpful. Take your time to phrase it clearly before you make your collage.

The Mail Art movement was based on the principle of sending small-scale works through the postal service. This approach often yielded unexpected collaborations and relationships. On Kawara regularly sent telegrams to friends and family simply telling them he was alive. Jacqui McLennan sent out envelopes and stamps to other artists asking them to decorate the envelopes and return them in the post – creating a unique collection of one-off pieces. One of the most famous artists from the movement, Ray Johnson (1927-1995) said, 'Mail Art is not square, a rectangle, or a photo or a book. It is a river.' Below is a space for you to create a piece of mail art – write a postcard to someone specific. It could be confessional, poetic, humorous, an invitation to respond...
It could be all text or it could be more visual. Use the rest of your collage sheet if it's useful.
