

BALTIC Open Submission 2020: Frequently Asked Questions

Can I submit a 2D work larger than 100cm x 100cm?

- No, we can only accept submission within these requirements to make sure we can include as many works as possible in the exhibition.

Can I submit a 3D work larger than 100cm x 100cm x 100cm?

- No, we can only accept submission within these requirements to make sure we can include as many works as possible in the exhibition.

Can I submit a work which would be hung from the ceiling?

- We have limited capacity for hanging in the gallery space, but could accommodate up to 5kg in weight, dimensions 1m x 1m x 1m maximum. This dimension would not need to include the hanging method (e.g. rope/string/wire). Please note BALTIC may need to affix attachments should your work be chosen for the exhibition. Existing attachments may be removed if required for reasons of health and safety.

Can I make more one submission for consideration by the panel?

- The panel would only be able to consider the first entry submitted, therefore please do only submit one entry.

Can I submit a film longer than 90 seconds?

- The final film can be longer than 90 seconds but the panel will be only able to look at a 90 second excerpt of the film initially. Therefore please only upload 90 seconds or indicate a 90 second section by giving a time to begin watching from. If the panel require further viewing of the full length film, they will be in touch directly during the shortlisting process.

Is this opportunity only available to those living in the North East of England?

- Yes, those living in the following postcodes are eligible: NE, DL, DH, SR, TS and TD codes in NE England. This can be part-time, however you will need to provide one of the listed postcodes when applying to be eligible.
